

Accident Tips:

Call the Police or CHP or 911 for Help

If anyone is injured, please call 911 for an ambulance. Even if no one is hurt or when ambulance care is declined, you should always call the police to report the incident. The presence of the police can keep a bad situation from escalating.

Be Calm

Often people become angry or distraught after an accident however the calm person that gathers the information on this form will have a better chance resolving their claim successfully.

If You Think You Are Injured, Say So

Often people politely say that they are 'fine' or 'okay' when asked at the accident scene if they are injured and then immediately go to a doctor or ER. If you think you may be injured, saying so is often better than being polite.

If you are injury trauma care and comfort can be administered by ambulance personnel in route to the ER. Worry about paying for the ambulance? If the accident is not your fault, often the healthcare providers will wait for payment when the claim to settles where there is insurance.

Get Medical Care & Treatment

If you are injured, your claim may be analyzed by the type of diagnosed injuries and the treatments your injuries need. Sometimes injuries are first felt in the days following the accident. Upon the onset of any injury, seek medical treatment.
